






Smartphone Users by the millions

What is a QR Code?

- Quick Response Code
- Designed by Denso Wave in 1994, a subsidiary of Toyota
- Adapted to mobile marketing in 2003

What makes a QR code?

- Similar to a barcode
- Black squares arranged in a square pattern
- Holds virtually any type of data
- Error correction capabilities



Why are QR codes used?

- Communicate a lot of information through minimal space
- Give users a mobile experience
- Share information on the go

How are QR codes used?


- Link visitors to websites

- On wearable material


